During our LWVEA Retreat on July 20, the Board discussed and tentatively set the calendar items listed below. So, mark your calendars in pencil (if you are still doing it the old fashioned way) in case changes are made. Some times speakers can't make the date we set or the venue is not available.

It was agreed at the Annual Meeting in June that our League would follow the "education and advocacy" priorities established by the State League—Dark Money in Politics, Education, Healthcare and the Water Wars. It was also agreed that we make an effort to hold "Hot Topic" sessions on current issues of interest to our local communities. These would be coordinated and led by interested League Board and/or non-Board members. These sessions will be added to the calendar if enough interest is shown.

LWVEA will also be co-sponsoring many of these events with AAUW, PTAs, Libraries, Retired Teachers, and other groups who would be interested and have compatible Missions and meet our Non-Partisan Policy.
